
STATE UNINSURANCE RATES CONTINUED TO FALL IN 2015

ESTIMATES FROM THE


AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY (ACS)

New data from the ACS show that the nation's uninsured rate declined in 2015, falling 2.3 percentage points from 11.7% in 2014 to 9.4% in 2015. This drop is consistent with the <u>historic decrease seen between 2013 and 2014</u>. Uninsurance also fell broadly at the state level, with 47 states and the District of Columbia reporting significant declines. Three states (North Dakota, South Dakota, and Wyoming) saw no significant change, and no state reported a significant increase.

NATIONAL UNINSURED RATE OVER TIME, 2008-2015




DECLINE IN STATE UNINSURED RATES, 2014-2015
