

State All-Payer Claims Database (APCD) Snapshots

Center for Consumer Information & Insurance Oversight (CCIIO) Cycle III Rate Review Grants Fund New APCDs March 10, 2014


The implementation of the Affordable Care Act brought increased attention to state-operated All-Payer Claims Databases (APCDs). APCDs are comprehensive databases that include healthcare claims from payers such as Medicare, Medicaid, commercial health plans, self-insured organizations, and prescription drug plans within a particular state. APCDs are often used to publicly report on healthcare costs, utilization rates, and quality measures. Recently, a grant opportunity from the Consumer Information and Insurance Oversight (CCIIO) provided states with financial resources to develop or enhance their state-operated APCDs. These grants, referred to as the Cycle III Rate Review Grants, were designed to help states improve their health insurance premium rate review processes and enhance price transparency. Many states secured funding for their APCDs as part of the "Data Center" portion of the grant program, which provided states with the opportunity to increase transparency around healthcare costs for consumers, businesses, and other stakeholders. In September 2013, \$67 million was awarded to 20 states and one territory as part of this third round of funding. Of these awardees, 11 states will use a portion of the CCIIO funds to enhance their existing APCDs, and two states (Arkansas and Hawaii) will use the funds to develop new APCDs.

This overview provides a snapshot of the proposed APCD development and enhancement activities for the Cycle III Rate Review Grantees. The following states have established APCDs in place, but did not receive Cycle III funding for APCD-related activities and thus are not included in the overview: Maine, Tennessee, Vermont, and Wisconsin.




