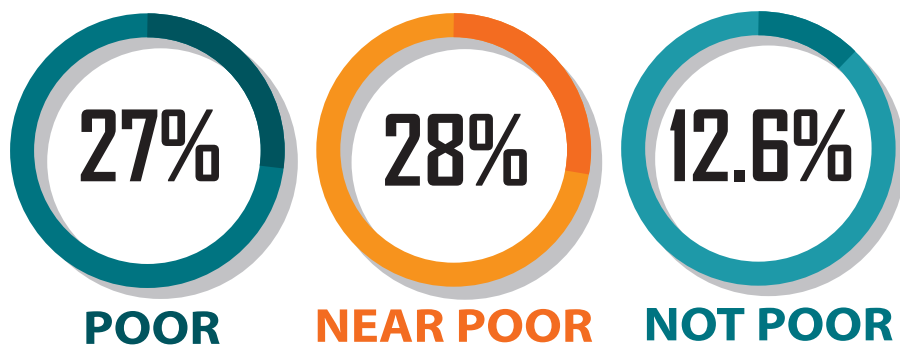

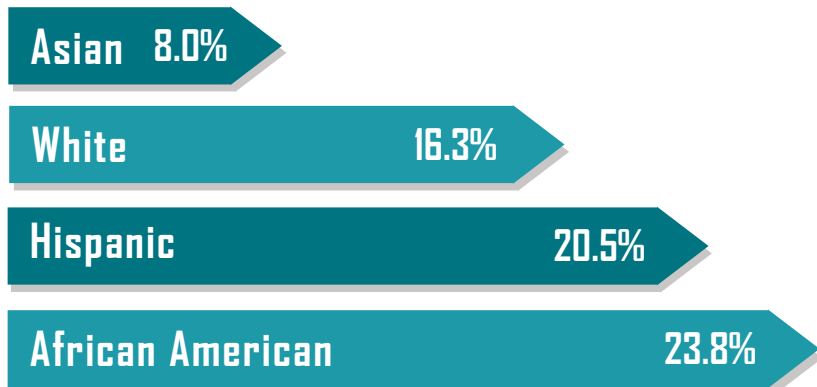

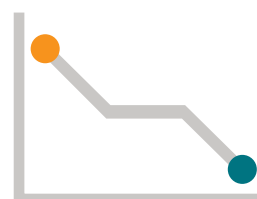

## BASED ON HEALTH INSURANCE STATUS



**32%** of UNINSURED people who live in families reported problems paying medical bills in the past 12 months.



**12%** of PRIVATELY INSURED people who live in families reported problems paying medical bills in the past 12 months.
