

Percentage of People by Type of Health Insurance Coverage: 2022



Percentage of People by Type of Health Insurance Coverage: 2022









CPS ASEC Summary

- The percentage of people without health insurance coverage for the entire calendar year was 7.9 percent, or 25.9 million people.
- Between 2021 and 2022, the uninsured rate decreased 0.4 percentage points, and the number of uninsured decreased by about 1.3 million people.
- The rate of Medicare coverage increased between 2021 and 2022, driven by an increase in the population over age 65.
- The increase in the insured rate occurred across many sociodemographic groups.









- The uninsured rate for nonexpansion states was 11.8 percent.
- Wisconsin had the lowest uninsured rate of all nonexpansion states with 5.2 percent uninsured.
- Texas had the highest uninsured rate of all nonexpansion states with 16.6 percent uninsured.

Summary of Findings and More



- In the CPS ASEC, the uninsured rate decreased by 0.4 percentage points, driven by an increase in Medicare coverage.
- In the ACS, the uninsured rate among states ranged from 2.4 percent in Massachusetts to 16.6 percent in Texas.
- Between 2021 and 2022, both Oklahoma and New Mexico's uninsured rate declined by about 2 percentage points.
- In the CPS ASEC the uninsured rate for all of 2022 was 7.9 percent.
- In the ACS the uninsured rate at the time of interview was 8.0 percent.


